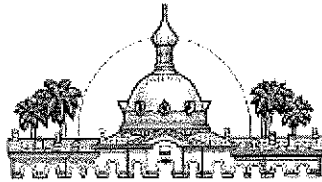

- A-44f Staff requested a **deferral until November 21** for consideration of the award of the bid on licensed collection of delinquent accounts to The CBE Group, Inc.

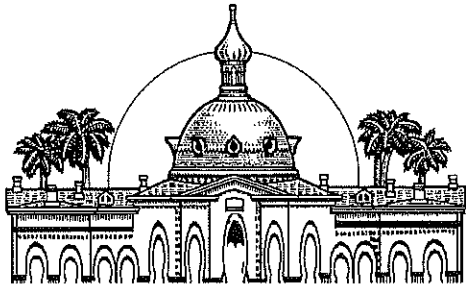

I. BACKGROUND:

This report provides the Board with updated information regarding the County's actions for compliance with the Americans with Disability Act (ADA) and recommendations for the Board's approval to continue progress on the subject.

The ADA enacted in 1990, prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities in all programs, activities and services of public entities. The five titles that support the ADA are: Title I (Employment), Title II (Public Entities), Title III (Private Facilities), Title IV (Communications), and Title V (Miscellaneous). Title II specifically covers programs, activities and services of public entities (State and local Government).

Hillsborough County is committed to the principles of the ADA and has undertaken substantial compliance efforts in the past decade. This effort included revisions to employment policies and practices, modifying service delivery and making structural changes for barrier removal. An estimated \$5.9 million has been committed to past and current accessibility projects under the Capital Improvement Program (CIP). These included approximately \$2.5-million of accessibility modifications of various libraries, social service facilities, the County Center and other facilities with high public access requirements, together with approximately \$3.4-million for the ADA Ramp program for sidewalks within the transportation portion of the CIP.

II. ADA EVALUATION AND TRANSITION PLAN

As part of the continuing compliance with the ADA, and pursuant to Title II, in 1999-2000, the Office of the County Administrator through the County's ADA Liaison, oversaw a self evaluation of County policies and practices and a physical survey of over 200 existing County facilities. These facilities were identified as those where moderate to high degree of public access is required or expected. Facilities which do not require public access were not included. The physical survey was conducted by an outside consultant, Abilities, Inc. The findings are summarized as follows:

- No discriminatory issues were noted.
- Access is currently available in the majority of County facilities but additional barrier removal work needs to be performed, especially at some high public access government facilities and parks.

The primary outcome was the development of a proposed Transition Plan for Hillsborough County, pursuant to Title II of the ADA. Public input was solicited during its preparation. The proposed Transition Plan is attached to this report as Attachment 1 for the Board's information.

III. ADA ACTION PLAN/PROPOSED FUNDING SCHEDULE

The proposed ADA Transition Plan includes an Action Plan which lists 178 recommended projects by priority within the Government Facilities, Libraries, Fire Services, Parks and Water Services programs of the CIP, with estimated costs and completion dates for each. The prioritization is based on the levels of current accessibility, degree of public access required and available resources including current and future funding and manpower considerations. Estimated costs are based primarily on the physical surveys completed by Abilities Inc., and projected completion dates for the projects are based on funding being available per the proposed funding plan outlined below. Each facility/project will be further scrutinized to prepare construction scopes consistent with the ADA Architectural Guidelines (ADAAG) and/or the Florida Accessibility Code for Building Construction. Examples of the types of barrier removal anticipated are: provision of accessible parking spaces pavement/stripping, sidewalks, ramps, handrails, signage, accessible doorways, accessible hardware, accessible pathways, elevator modifications and accessible restrooms. The total estimated cost for the recommended 178 projects is \$4.83-million, of which \$ 0.75-million is available in remaining balances within the approved FY01-05 Capital Improvement Program.

In addition to the projects listed under the ADA Action Plan, it is also recommended that the County continue with the ADA Ramp projects in the future. Public Works Department anticipates an unmet need for an additional \$3.6-million for ADA Ramp construction.

The total amount of future funding recommended (including ADA Ramps) is \$7.68 million.

Per the above, it is recommended that future funding be phased from FY 02 through FY 07. There are no additional operating costs estimated for the projects included in the ADA Action Plan.

In previous years, the County has used a variety of funding sources for accessibility projects within the above listed programs, such as: Ad Valorem, Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Community Investment Tax I (CIT I) and Gas Tax (for ADA Ramps).

The Management and Budget Department will review the proposed funding plan and make recommendations for potential funding sources and funding schedule during the upcoming budget process.

IV. CONCLUSIONS

To continue with the County's ADA compliance efforts, it is anticipated that the Board will be requested to consider future adoption of the ADA Transition Plan. This issue will be brought back for further discussion as part of the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) workshop scheduled for February 14, 2001.

Americans with Disabilities (ADA) Transition Plan Update December, 2002

On October 17, 2001, the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners adopted its Americans with Disabilities (ADA) Transition Plan as required by Federal law. The Action Plan listed 178 recommended projects requiring improved accessibility. These projects were prioritized based on levels of current accessibility, degree of public access required, and available resources. Estimated costs were based primarily on physical site surveys completed by Abilities, Inc. It was also determined that each facility/project would be further scrutinized to prepare construction scopes consistent with the ADA Architectural Guidelines (ADAAG) and/or the Florida Accessibility Code for Building Construction. An Access Team was established to provide input into the prioritization and implementation process.

This report is prepared as a one-year status update to review the progress made to date and to note any significant changes that may require future attention. During FY 01-02, the ADA Transition Plan implementation efforts focused attention on enhancing accessibility compliance in level one-priority government facilities, libraries, and parks and recreation centers with targeted completion dates of FY 02-03.

In FY 01-02, \$768,000 was budgeted for ADA projects from Ad Valorem taxes to proceed with construction/renovation activity. An additional \$525,000 has been contracted for the ADA Curb Ramp/Sidewalk Program. The attached Updated Action Plan reflects projects are on-schedule or ahead of schedule and that good progress has been made this past year. Collaboration among divisions within county departments and between departments has allowed for maximum utilization of resources to improve accessibility beyond the minimum requirements of the ADA and to achieve maximum impact. (For example, a combination of R3M and "ADA" funds and resources has been used to address issues at Children's Services that will ultimately maximize the impact of accessibility on the Children's Services campus.)

A summary discussion of each major facilities category follows. A matrix describing the updated status of facilities is attached.

I. Government Facilities:

Under the "government facilities" area, senior centers, children's services facilities, the County Center, and the courts project were given level one-priority. Of six identified level one-priority projects scheduled for completion in 2003, three projects have been completed, Ruskin Senior Center, at least two sites on the Children's Services campus, and the County Center. The Wimauma Senior Center is in construction with a projected completion date of mid-November 2002. The remaining projects have had design work completed and are in construction procurement. A CDBG grant was secured for the Wimauma Senior Center project.

The Courts project includes ADA work on the South Annex, North Annex, 700 Twiggs Building, Plant City Courthouse and the County Courthouse (on Pierce Street). These sites have completion dates ranging from 2004 to 2007. Work is progressing steadily in these areas.

Projects in level two-priority are in various stages of design and construction. Presently, these facilities have ADA completion dates of 2006 although it is likely that several of these projects may be completed earlier based on funding and resource availability/constraints.

Projects in level three-priority are pending confirmation of scope and have a completion horizon of no sooner than 2006.

The ADA Access Team, in addition to input from community meetings, continues to monitor progress and provide periodic review. No significant problems have been noted at this time.

II. Libraries:

Ten level one-priority projects were identified ranging in completion time horizons from 2001 to 2004. The Austin Davis Library project (2001) has been completed and five additional projects are in the design phase. Three additional libraries are scheduled to have ADA work completed as part of ongoing renovation work to be completed by 2004 while one additional project scheduled for 2004 is pending design and construction activity.

One level two and one level three-priority library is in design phase. These adjustments to the original estimated schedule reflect economies of scale in architectural procurement for design work.

III. Parks and Recreation:

ADA compliance issues for this area of the ADA Plan primarily focused attention on four areas of improving accessibility: parking and sidewalks, drinking fountains, building modifications, and the regional parks. During FY 01-02, priority was given to completing all regional park ADA requirements in addition to the level one-priority sites/facilities identified in the ADA Transition Plan.

Eight of ten regional parks had work completed in 2002 with the remaining two scheduled for completion in 2003. An additional twelve level one-priority sites/facilities were completed during FY01-02 and two future projects were brought forward and completed in 2002. The remaining thirteen level one-priority sites/facilities are scheduled for completion in FY 02-03. All identified level one-priority sites/facilities had completion target dates of 2002 or 2003 and are meeting those expectations.

The greatest challenge noted in achieving Plan recommendations for parks and recreation sites was the underestimate in sidewalk related needs/costs to achieve accessibility from parking areas to the actual play or recreational areas in the parks. Presently, shortfalls have been offset by using other CIT projects to help meet ADA compliance within those sites/facilities. This issue will warrant continued monitoring to ensure adequate budgetary considerations.

IV. Fire and Rescue:

The one project at Fire Rescue Headquarters is pending design and construction for completion date of 2008.

V. Water Department:

The one project at Water Department Administration is pending design and construction for completion date of 2008.

VI. ADA Curb-Ramp/Sidewalk Program:

During FY 01-02, a contract for 943 ramps was bid. Approximately 625 of the ramps have been completed to date. The contract remains underway. A plan is in place to develop an ADA Curb Ramp Transition Plan for Hillsborough County during FY 02-03 under the auspices of the Public Works Department. This Plan is being developed with interdepartmental and community input. The resulting Plan is anticipated to be complete by December 31, 2003.

Conclusion:

During this first year of funding of the ADA Transition Plan good progress has been made toward achieving the recommended implementation strategies to improve accessibility to the county's programs and facilities. Priority projects are being completed within timely completion estimates. With limited exception (as described above), projects are being completed within reasonable cost estimates.

Recommendations for future consideration include:

- Continue monitoring and review of cost estimates and projected completion dates for identified projects.
- Continue to identify and apply for alternate sources of funding to implement the ADA Action Plan.
- Assess any previously unidentified accessibility issues for future addendum to the ADA Plan.
- Identify any potential difficulties in addressing ADA compliance.
- Continue involvement of the ADA Access Team in the review and recommendation process toward achieving improved accessibility to the county's programs and services.

PART I – PLAN DESCRIPTION

A. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) was enacted in 1990. The purpose of the ADA is to provide equal access to employment, programs, services, and facilities for individuals with disabilities. Hillsborough County, Florida is committed to the principles of the ADA and seeks to make its programs accessible to individuals with disabilities.

Title II of the ADA and regulations enacted pursuant to Title II require a covered public entity, such as Hillsborough County, to develop a transition plan. CFR 35.150(d)(1). Per CFR 35.150(d)(3), a transition plan must include the following items:

- i) Identify physical obstacles in the public entity's facilities that limit the accessibility of its programs or activities;
- ii) Describe in detail the methods that will be used to make the facilities accessible;
- iii) Specify the schedule for taking the steps necessary to achieve compliance and identify steps that will be taken during each year of the transition period; and
- iv) Indicate the official responsible for implementation of the Plan.

Hillsborough County has developed this Transition Plan (the "Plan") in accordance with these requirements. The purpose of this Plan is to detail how Hillsborough County intends to modify certain County-owned facilities to better provide public access for individuals with disabilities. Title II and its regulations make clear that program access is intended to remove physical barriers to County services and programs, but it generally does not require that a County government make each facility, or each part of a facility, accessible so long as the program or service can be made available in the most integrated setting possible. Every attempt has been made to make such programs and services accessible when viewed in their entirety.

B. PREVIOUS COMPLIANCE EFFORTS

Hillsborough County has put a tremendous effort into compliance with the provisions of the ADA over the past decade. This effort has included an estimated \$5.5 million commitment to current and past projects. These projects include accessibility modifications of the County Center, the Haven Poe Runaway Center, and the Main Library renovations, among others. These projects also include an ADA ramp program, including curb cuts at pedestrian intersections throughout the County's jurisdiction. The County has prepared a master plan for the County Court complex that includes renovating those affected Court facilities to be ADA compliant, with the remainder addressed in Part II of this Plan. Additionally, Hillsborough County

developed a master communication plan that includes improved services to citizens with sensory disabilities, including the use of interpreters, closed captioning, Braille and large print as needed.

C. PLAN DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

In spring 1999, the County Departments conducted self-evaluations of their policies and practices as they relate to the provision of services to persons with disabilities. These self-evaluations focused on identifying any policies and practices in County services or programs that discriminate with regards to persons with disabilities and to make recommendations for removal or modification of those policies or practices. No discriminatory issues were noted. Areas for more uniform communication procedures were noted and are underway. A continued effort to solicit input from individuals with disabilities in employee training and in barrier removal opportunities is encouraged.

On October 6, 1999, the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners retained Abilities, Inc. (the "Consultant") to assist with the development of a transition plan. The Consultant surveyed over 200 facilities within Hillsborough County government, focusing on the identification and removal of architectural barriers to County programs. The surveyed facilities were identified as those having a moderate to high degree of public access. Facilities not requiring public access were not included in this survey. The Consultant also polled individuals and organizations representing individuals with disabilities as to their opinions regarding the accessibility of County programs.

The Consultant determined that access is currently available in most of the evaluated sites, but it also indicated that work needs to be done to remove barriers to some of the programs offered by Hillsborough County. Libraries, a large part of the County buildings, were found to be largely accessible to and useable by individuals with disabilities. Parks and recreational facilities ranged from significantly inaccessible to exemplary access.

The Consultant prepared a document compiling its detailed evaluations of County facilities and recommendations for modifications for areas the Consultant deemed non-compliant. This 425-page compilation of the site evaluations and recommendations is contained in a separate binder labeled Exhibit A to Hillsborough County Transition Plan. Copies of the compilation will be maintained at the County Clerk's office and with the ADA Coordinator for detailed viewing.

This compilation, along with a brief narrative, was presented to the public for comment at an August 9, 2000 public meeting. Presentations were made to and input sought from the Alliance for Citizens with Disabilities-Hillsborough County and the Mayor's Alliance for Persons with Disabilities.

In general, parking, accessible paths of travel into facilities, and restroom access dominated the recommendations contained in the compilation. Recommendations ranged from raising the height of a sign to be in compliance with the regulations to reconfiguring restroom areas or building a ramp. As the Consultant did not have the engineering expertise to determine what was feasible at a given facility, the modifications recommended do not necessarily represent the best or the only resolution to the concerns raised in the compilation.

An Internal Access Team has been established with members from Architectural Services, Facilities Management, Library Services, the Parks and Recreation Department, the County Attorney's Office, the County's ADA Coordinator, and representatives from the disability community. The Internal Access Team reviewed the Consultant's evaluations and recommendations contained in the compilation, visited sites, evaluated many possible resolutions, reviewed existing renovation and improvement plans, and assessed resources and manpower. In places, the Internal Access Team noted that a solution may be provided in a manner different from the initial recommendation but consistent with the ADA requirements and intent of Hillsborough County to comply with such requirements. From this information, the Internal Access Team, which will remain in place while this Plan proceeds, prepared this Plan.

D. SUMMARY OF PLAN PROPOSALS

Part II of the Plan titled "ADA Action Plan" contains a list of the facilities requiring modifications, targeted time frames for completion, and estimated costs. The facilities are listed under the following categories: Government Facilities, Fire and Rescue, Water Department, Library Services and Parks and Recreation Program. Within these categories, facilities were prioritized based on the current level of accessibility, level of use by public, existing projects plans, and available resources, including funding and manpower.

The projected completion dates and cost estimates are contingent upon available resources, including current and future funding and manpower considerations. This Plan is intended to be a working document for the purposes of planning ADA barrier removal needs within County facilities. It is intended that the Plan be reviewed annually and that updates be incorporated to reflect progress and changes in implementing recommendations resulting from resource allocation, relocation of programs or modifications of programs.
