Spring/Summer: 8 a.m. - 7 p.m.

Fall/Winter: 8 a.m. - 6 p.m.

Fees Entry

- \$2 per vehicle up to eight people
- Boat launch: \$5
- Kayak rental: \$25 for 4 hours

Camping Rates

- Regular Rate: \$24 per night
- Senior Discounts: 55 and over, \$18 per night
65 and over, \$12 per night, only residents of Hillsborough County qualify for \$12 rates

Park Rules

- Pets must be in your control at all times and on a 6-foot or shorter, non-retractable leash.
- No alcohol.
- No disruptive behavior.
- Help protect our parks and environment by properly disposing of litter.

Shelters

- Shelters 3, 6, 12, 14, 15, 17 and the multipurpose room may be reserved online at www.HCFLGov.net/parks. All other shelters are first come, first served.

Annual Passes

- Annual entry and boat launch passes are available online and in rental office. After Hours Fishing Passes are available with purchase of annual pass. Pass prices listed online.
- Discounted annual entry passes are available for veterans, first responders, and law enforcement who live or work in Hillsborough County.

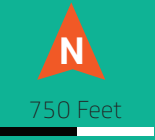

E. G. Simmons Park



About the park

Developed from 258 acres of native mangrove-lined shores and intertwined waterways, E.G. Simmons Conservation Park includes 200 acres of mangrove swamp that is preserved as a bird and wildlife sanctuary. Birdwatchers can view protected species such as the roseate spoonbill and the bald eagle. Visitors can take a leisurely stroll on the 700-foot stretch of beach along Tampa Bay, fish on the pier and from shore, kayak through mangrove islands, or set up camp at one of the park's 110 campsites complete with electricity, potable water, picnic tables, and fire rings.
