

Upland Wildlife Habitat Preservation Area Management Plan Submittal Requirements

The following information must be addressed within a proposed management plan. The completed proposal must provide necessary information in a narrative format for each category identified.

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	I.	INTRODUCTION:
		A) Site name, location, size, legal description, access to the property, out parcels (if applicable), encroachments (if applicable), and adjacent areas. [Map 1]
		B) Site history, including past, present and proposed uses. [Map 2] Map 2 should depict managed areas and proposed developed areas.
	II.	NATURAL RESOURCES:
		A) Natural Plant Communities (Habitat) [Map A] – including preserved areas and protective buffers. This segment must include a vegetative cover description using FLUCCS and including acreage.
		B) Fish and Wildlife Resources [Map B] (Provide description)
		C) Endangered, Threatened, and Species of Special Concern [Map C] (Provide description)
		D) Geologic Features and Topography [Map D]
		E) General Soil Types and Drainage [Map E]
	III.	MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND PROCEDURES: This section must address the objective(s) of the management proposal in accordance with DRP Manuel Section 4.1.6.1.6 and the associated affects on the following –
		A) Fish and Wildlife Resources
		B) Natural Habitats, including significant and essential wildlife habitats
		C) Wildlife Corridor
		D) Proposed passive uses
		E) Timing of Implementation – Avoid breeding seasons if possible
		F) Party implementing management proposal
		G) Management responsibility of plan
	IV.	RESTORATION: Describe the method(s) of restoration to be undertaken. These methods should include natural succession, prescribed burning, exotic plant removal, enhancement through transplanting of species, improvements of surface water quality and/or surface water elevation enhancement.
	V.	PROTECTION: Discuss preservation method(s) which may include establishment of easements; restricted access, i.e. signage, fencing, patrolling, etc.; and measures to be taken that will deter poaching, dumping, trespassing, etc.
	VI.	MONITORING: Discuss the procedures for assessing the progress of plan implementation and term of monitoring. Identify primary and other agents in

maintenance responsibilities.

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
