

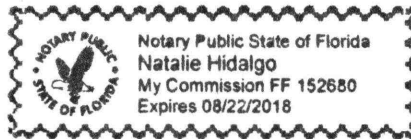

MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING HELD ON OCTOBER 27, 2015 TO CONSIDER THE 2015 FIVE YEAR UPDATE TO THE HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY TRAUMA PLAN

A public hearing was held by the Hillsborough County Trauma Agency on Tuesday, October 27, 2015, at 9:00 a.m. at the Hillsborough County Children's Board at 1002 East Palm Avenue, Tampa, Florida 33605 for the purpose of approving the *2015 Update to the Hillsborough County Trauma Plan*.

Barbara K. Uzenoff, RN, Trauma Coordinator/Manager of the Hillsborough County Trauma Agency, called the public hearing to order at 9:05 A.M. She stated that a court reporter was retained for this meeting, which was also being recorded. She introduced the Trauma Agency's Attorney, Paul Johnston, and the Trauma Agency's Medical Director, Dr. Marshall Frank, who were also present.

The attendees were notified that the agenda and a copy of the *Matrix of Changes Between the 2010 and 2015 Trauma Plan Updates* were available as handouts in the room. The proposed draft of the *Plan* was previously emailed to individuals on the distribution list for the Trauma Audit Committee.

Ms. Uzenoff announced that the order of business for the hearing would be as follows. First, she would be giving a high-level summary of the changes made to the *Hillsborough County Trauma Plan* since it was last updated five years ago. Following that, she will take any questions from the audience and finally, the floor would be open to any comments that individuals may wish to make. Attendees are asked to submit any written materials they wish to provide to her by the end of the hearing. Written comments will also be accepted through the end of the business day on Friday, November 13, 2015, via email to uzenoffb@hillsboroughcounty.org.

Ms. Uzenoff closely followed the *Matrix* handout outline in relating her high-level summary of the principal differences between the 2010 and 2015 versions. She explained that the trauma rules specify the content and sequence to be ordered in the *Trauma Plan*, and that the *Matrix* mirrored the *Plan's* organization layout. The final two attachments referenced at the end of the document will be available only after the *Plan* has been sent to Board of County Commissioners and the State for approval.

After delivering the highlights of the *2015 Trauma Plan* changes, there was only question posed from the audience. Dr. David Ciesla, Medical Director, Tampa General Trauma Services asked about the nature of the joint venture that his hospital had entered into.








There were no other questions, and there were no comments.








She reiterated that written comments would be accepted via email through the end of the business day on Friday, November 13, 2015.
